

Maths Courses: Developing Number Sense & Developing Functional Number Skills

These courses are for professionals working with pupils with Down Syndrome or with difficulty acquiring maths skills

Both sessions are led by Anne Gullick MSc, B'Ed(Hons)

Children with Down Syndrome often struggle with numeracy. Their numeracy levels can be on average 2 years behind their literacy levels.

Course 1 - for Early Years Professionals:

Developing Number Sense - Tuesday 9th October 2018 9.30am-12.30pm

This course will define what number sense is, look at how the learning profile affects number acquisition and explore practical activities/resources available to develop the basic counting skills needed to become numerate.

Course 2 - For Primary Professionals:

Developing Functional Number Skills - Tuesday 6th November 2018 9.30am-12.30pm

This course will be of interest to those working with children who have already acquired basic counting skills and are ready to move on to the next step. It will explore children's concept of numbers to 10 and beyond, looking at factors affecting learning, and consider practical activities / resources available to help build functional number skills.
