

DSPL7 is funded by the local authority to deliver the aims of the SEND strategy at a local level. We commit 85% of our budget to these priority areas, which are:

• Behaviour and SEMH	• Specialist Provision
• Targeted SEND services	• SLCN (including ASD)
• Early Years	• Post 16

The remaining 15% is directed towards locally identified priorities, which in DSPL7 are:

- Support for CYP with Down Syndrome
- Support for students in KS3
